



Always be prepared, a tsunami may occur anytime

- a. Prepare a family emergency plan
- b. Prepare a safety backpack
- c. Identify the danger zones, safe areas and the Assembly locations
- d. Identify evacuation routes



Pay attention to any of these warning signals

a. Very strong earthquake (it is difficult to walk, there are falling objects, damage to structures)

DROPI

- b. Long duration earthquake (about 1 minute or more)
- c. Official message by sirens, commercial radio, television, NOAA radio
- d. Sudden sea level change
- e. Loud noise coming from the sea



In case of an earthquake protect yourself

- a. Drop
- b. Cover
- c. Hold on



Move aw ay from hazard areas (in preference order depending on your location)

- a. Run to higher ground and / or away from the Coast
- b. Go to a third floor or higher
- c. Climb a tree
- d. Run to an assembly point



EVACUATION



Stay in the safe area until Authorities indicate the danger has passed, this may take many hours.
