

Finally, on May 19, 2010, **JABA** conducted in Mayaguez its Full Scale Exercise for selected Emergency Management personnel. The exercise involved the transfer to a safe area after evacuation of a sports venue (Isidoro García Stadium) following a Tsunami Warning. With approval of the PRSN, the scenario that was used for the exercise was based on NOAA's LANTEX 2009 Exercise. [ANNEXES 6 y 7].





OTHER ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THE XXI GAMES

Even though the contract between the **PRSN** and **JABA** only pertained to the **Tsunami Annex** of the **Games' Security and Emergency Management Plan**, **JABA** has made several important voluntary contributions to the Security Committee, including the following:

- Drafting nine (9) other Annexes for specific Emergency Management contingencies (Medical Emergencies, Fires, Explosions, Collapse of Structures, Tropical Storms and Hurricanes, Local Weather Emergencies, Earthquakes, Hazardous Materials Emergencies and Mass Fatalities).
- Contracting with TechRadium to provide a service for instantaneous transmission of e-mails and text messages on cellular phones, to be employed by the Games' Security and Emergency Management Committee to alert fifty (50) key staffers of the Organizing Committee and the Response organization. This way **JABA** has voluntarily provided the technical means to transmit tsunami warning and other emergency messages to staffers that will not have emergency portable radiotelephones. We believe that this contribution may have a critical impact in the delivery of a fast response to any incident that occurs during the Games.



Furthermore, the PRSN invited JABA's Ferdinand E. Sánchez-Martínez, Esq. to make a presentation on the Games' Tsunami plans during Tsunami Ready Summit held in Mayagüez from May 10 to May 14, 2010. This activity was co-sponsored by the **PRSN**, **PREMA** and several Federal agencies.

JABA expresses its gratitude to the **Puerto Rico Seismic Network** for giving us this singular opportunity to serve our country in an event of the magnitude and significance of the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games.
